3) University of Oregon Updates – Cami Thompson

- a. Hamilton Residence Hall Update
 - i. Transformation Project to turn space into park/green space
 - ii. On hold until summer 2024
- b. Romania Site Development Update
 - i. Moving forward with new mixed-use modal: Retail and housing
 - ii. Preserves historically designated car dealership showroom
 - iii. Construction expected to begin in 2024, up to three years of construction
 - iv. Private developer leased by UO
- c. Big Dates for the Community
 - i. Hayward

4) Lane Transit District – Pat Walsh and Tom Schwetz

- a. LTD History/Background
 - i. Board of Directors, district based and appointed by the Governor
 - ii. 170 bus operators, need 215 to provide prior service level
 - iii. 113 buses
 - iv. Paratransit: RideSource is non emergency medical transport for customers needing to go to the doctor's appointments
 - v. \$141M dollars, half earned through payroll tax
 - vi. <u>Jameson Auten</u> has been a transformational CEO, he's been there for a year and "reimaging the ride"
- b. LTD undertaking an operational analysis
- c. Community Questions
 - i. Does EmX need two lanes in the Franklin Boulevard Transformation project? One in each direction for EmX
 - 1. LTD: Independent lanes needed to prevent delays mid-day, when ridership is peak
 - Community input: not having independent lanes is a major problem for EmX
 - ii. LTD replants any trees removed for EmX projects
 - iii. Suggestions to add smaller buses/micro, on-demand mobility

5) Friends of Trees – Jeff Lanza, Planting Program Manager

a. Overview: Mission of Friends of Trees is to provide relief from the urban elements of sidewalks, transportation corridors, buildings. Trees connect to each other and to nature.

- b. Trees and public transportation both in public right of way
- c. Increased trees can help lessen drastic impacts of climate change
- d. Neighborhood Tree Planting event happening this Saturday. Planting occurs in winter/dormant season.
- e. Mature tree canopy leads to slower speeds on corridors.
- f. Funding: organization always looking for individual donors to supplement grants
